whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Spratly Williams, Newt Harris and William Jenkins or any two of them do audit, settle and report to this Court the account of the defendant Thomas as late guardian to John B. Ridley dec'd that the same Commissioners, or those acting under this order, do divide the negro slaves to which the said John B. was entitled at the time of his death, equally between the Complainant Louisa and the defendant Francis - that they also allot to the complainant Louisa in absolute property, one fourth of the negro slaves held by her as her dower in her deceased husband's estate. It is further ordered that the defendant Thomas pay the balance, if any, which shall appear due from him on the account as herein before directed, in equal moieties, to the complainant and the defendant Francis. And that the Commissioners report to this Court in order to a final decree.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine, state and settle an account current of John English's administration on Thomas English's estate - George Harris account as Sheriff and Committee of Arthur Mann dec'd who was guardian to Alexander Hills orphans, and Benjamin Cobbs guardianship of James Cobrell's orphans and make separate reports thereof to Court.

Ordered that the account of Jesse Drewry amounting to \$10.50 cents be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts for his examination and payment.
