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the Dece for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Elizabeth Hunt
die? and return the appraisement under their hands to leave.

Jeremiah Cobb who was appointed to superintend the building of a Jail
for this County this day made a report which is ordered to be recorded and was these
words. To wit. "In obedience to the unrevoked order of Court appointing Commis-
sioners to let the building of a new Jail for this County, and also appointing me
to superintend the same. Report, that the work is now completed in all its parts
agreeably to the plan directed by the Court, except that the iron bars on the walls
and lower floors. They are put in, and crossed at right angles, instead of diagon-
ally as directed by the plan adopted by the Court. The reason for this alteration
was this. I found by adopting the plan in this respect, that the bars which were
some wider than it was contemplated they should be, left too little room on the
timbers to nail the ceiling as substantially as was necessarily required, and I
am of opinion that this mode of putting on the bars is preferable in point of
Strength, because the bars one way are well secured to the timbers, and are
less liable to be sprung. And I think it would be doing the undertaker injustice
to omit to state that he has taken unusual pains to have the materials of the
best kind and quality, and also the workmanship done in a masterly manner
as to strength and permanency. The law requires there should be stoves in
each of the rooms - and as they were not included in the contract for the build-
ing, it will be necessary that they be purchased and fitted up immediately. I would
also recommend that the front and rear sides of the Jail be enclosed something
upon the plan of the old Jail - I think that the Court should also make an order
for the old Jail to be taken down and removed, and I would suggest to the Court, whether
it would not be necessary to make some repairs to the public ground, and if so
whether the timbers of the old Jail could not be beneficially used for that purpose -
Respectfully Submitted to the Court. Jer Cobb. Jan'y 19th 1824."

And it is ordered that the Jail be repaired. And it is further ordered that Jer-
emiah Cobb. cause to be procured three stoves for the said Jail and one for the
Court house of this County and that the Sheriff of this County out of the contingent
fund in his hands not otherwise appropriated pay to the said Jeremiah Cobb
such sum or sums of money as will be sufficient to purchase said stoves.

On the motion of Thomas C Jones who produced to the Court the Sheriffs receipt
for the tax imposed by Law a license is granted him to keep an ordinary at
his house in this County till the first day of May next upon his giving bond with
good security according to Law. It appearing to the Court that the said Thomas C
Jones is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.
