In Chancery

This cause was this day docketed by consent of parties and report of the Court
and was heard on the bill and answer. Whereupon the Court doth adjudge order and
decree that one third in value of the land lying in the County of which Robert
Wellens died seized her allotted by proper miles and bounds to the defendant Sally
widow of the said Robert for her natural life as her dower in the same. It is more-
over decreed and ordered that the aforesaid tract of land including the remain-
der dependant upon the widows dower be sold on a credit of twelve months,
except so much as the costs of this suit which will be for cash, and the proceeds of
the sale divided into seven equal parts to be secured by seven bonds with approved
security, which said bonds are to be allotted in the following manner. One to the
complainant, one to the defendants Henry Gardner and Polly his wife, and one
to each of the other defendants or their guardians. and it is moreover decreed and
ordered that Benjamin Griffin, Walter Wellens, Richard B. Wells, and William
Richs or any three of them do carry the foregoing decree into effect and make
report thereof to the Court in order to a final decree.

Sally Porter widow of Jacob Porter *vs* and others

This cause was this day docketed by consent of parties and report of the
Court and was heard on the bill and answer. Whereupon the Court doth adjudge
order and decree that dower be assigned to the defendant Sally Porter widow of
Jacob Porter *de* in the land lying in the County whereof Jacob Porter died
seized by setting apart one third thereof in value by proper miles and
bounds. It is moreover decreed and ordered the said Tract of land including
the remainder dependant upon the dower estate of the said Sally Porter be
sold on a credit of twelve months except so much as the costs of this suit
which will be cash, after giving reasonable public notice of the time and
place of sale and the proceeds of the sale be divided into eleven equal
parts and eleven separate bonds be taken to secure the payment thereof
with good security and allot the said bonds in the following manner, one
to the complainant, one to James K. Stephens and Olive his wife, in
right of her said wife, one to James Porter and Nancy his wife in right
of his wife and one to each of the other defendants or their guardians.
