Arrested a negro woman slave the property of William Bell of this County was this day set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County and charged with breaking open the house of Nancy Turner (a free negro) on the 26<sup>th</sup> of December 1823 and stealing, taking and carrying away, one white cambric frock, one silk handkerchief one pair of cotton stockings, one shirt, 2 1/2 pounds of cotton yarn, one small piece of cotton cloth &c (the Court's command for her trial having failed to meet) and being thereof arraigned, pleaded not guilty and for her trial put herself upon her

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
