

On the motion of William E Daughtry he having paid the tax imposed by law a license is granted him to keep an Ordinary at his house till the first day of May next on his giving bond and Security according to Law. It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the said William E Daughtry is a man of good character and not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

Be it remembered that Nathan Parsons here in Court acknowledged himself indebted unto his calling James Pleasant Esq. Governor of this Commonwealth and his Successors in office for the time being in the sum of \$333 1/3 to be levied of his respective goods and chattels lands and tenements and to the said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Not upon this condition that if the said Nathan Parsons shall personally appear before the Judge of our Superior Court of Law for this County on the first day of the next term then and there to give such evidence as he knows or believes of the Commonwealth against Sterling Ivey who stands charged with felony and shall not depart thence without leave of the said Court then this recognizance is to be void.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.

The last Will and Testament of Richard Williamson dec<sup>d</sup> was proved by the oath of George W Edmunds, John Dayson and John Boon the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of Collin W Barnes the Executor therein named who made oath and together with Richard Blunt and Solomon Rochelle his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of ten thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form.

Ordered that James Taylor, John Barnett, William Bell and David Wood or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Richard Williamson dec<sup>d</sup> and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

The last Will and Testament of Thomas E. Crosby dec<sup>d</sup> was proved by the oath of Hubin Middleton and Robert Hicks Jr two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.
