This cause was this day docketed by consent of parties and adjourned of the Court and was heard upon the bill and answer. Whereupon the Court doth adjudge order and decree that one third of the tract of land lying in this County which Jesse Barnett dec'd seized be set apart by proper notes and bounds having regard to value, and be allotted to the Complamant Rhoda for her life as her dower in the same. It is moreover ordered that the said tract of land including the reversion dependant upon the dower estate and the slave above mentioned in the bill after giving reasonable public notice of the time and place of sale be sold on a credit of twelve months and the proceeds to be secured by bonds to be divided in the following manner. One fourth part of the sale of the said negro woman Rose to be allotted to the Complamant Rhoda in lieu of her interest in the same as the widow of the said Jesse Barnett, and the balance of the proceeds of both lands and slaves be divided into five equal parts by bond with approved security, one of which to be allotted to the guardians of each of the infant Complamants. And it is also ordered that the said Augustine Pope do render to this Court an account of his transactions upon the estate of the said Jesse Barnett to be stated and audited by persons hereinafter mentioned. It is finally ordered that Lewis Morrell, Dorey Bryant, Giles Barnett and Jacob Barnes or any three of them do carry the foregoing decree into effect and report to this Court in order to a final decree.
