Thomas late Sheriff of Southampton County, to whom the estate of Henry Briggs dec'd. was administered by his Executor, hath been committed, and Spencer Price and Emily his wife late Emily Briggs, widow of which of Henry Briggs dec'd. Richard Norwington and Nancy his wife late Nancy Briggs, Harry Briggs and Martha Louise Briggs an infant by her next friend

appointed by the Court &c. off.

This cause was this day docketed by consent of parties and assent of the Court, and was heard on the bill, answers filed, will exhibited, and argument of Counsel. Whereupon the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the slaves which are of the estate of Henry Briggs deceased except such as are allotted to the defendant Amelia for her life and such as specifically bequeathed to be divided into five equal parts having regard to value, and that one fifth part be allotted to the complainant William Henry and one fifth part to each of the defendants Richard Norwington and Harry Briggs and one fifth part to the heirs of the deceased Richard Norwington and that the remaining fifth part be divided into five equal parts in kind if practicable and divided in the same manner as above except as the remaining fifth which is to be allotted to Spencer Price on right of his wife Amelia who is entitled to the same as one of the distributees of her infant deceased child Eliza Bell Maria, and if the last mentioned lot of slaves cannot be divided in kind
