Henry Pettaway and the prisoner being fully heard by Counsel. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner ought to be tried for said offence at the next Superior Court to be held for this County.

Be it remembered, that William Whappell with Henry Pettaway and Benjamin Hines his securities here in Court acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Excellency James Pleasant Esq. Governor or chief magistrate of this Commonwealth and his Successors in Office for the sum being himself in the sum of \$500. and his said Securities in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars each to be levied of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements due to the said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said William Whappell shall personally appear before the Judge of our Superior Court of Law to be held for this County on the first day of the next Term by 10 O'Clock of that day then and there to abide the Judgment of the Court and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

Be it remembered that Lucy Myrick and Edwin Pettaway here in Court acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Excellency James Pleasant Jr Esq. Governor or chief magistrate of this Commonwealth and his Successors in Office for the sum being in the sum of \$333.33 $\frac{1}{3}$ cents each to be levied of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements and to the said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if they and each of them shall personally appear before the Judge of our Superior Court of Law of Southampton at the Courthouse on the first day of the next Term by 10 O'Clock of that day then and there to give such Testimony as they and each of them know in behalf of the Commonwealth against William W. Whappell who stands charged with murder and shall not depart thence without leave of the Court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
