This day came the parties by their Counsel and the persons appointed under the interlocutory decree made in cause at December Court 1823 to make division of the lands ~~and~~ therein mentioned this day made a report in the following words to wit: "By virtue of, and in obedience to a decree of the Court of Southampton County, bearing date December Court 1823 and hereto annexed. We the undersigned have sold the dower lands of Lucy Corbitt dec'd in Southampton County, on a credit of Twelve months (except twenty six dollars which was required in cash to pay present expenses) to Daniel Williams for eight hundred and fifty dollars and conveyed the same by deed, as will appear above. We have also taken four separate bonds for Two hundred and Six dollars and 25 cents each, making eight hundred and Twenty five dollars, the full amount of sale, after deducting the cash payment of \$25.00 - and delivered them over to the parties as will appear by the annexed receipts, which we pray may be taken and recorded as a part of our report. All which is respectfully Submitted. Given under our hands this 11th day of January 1824. It is to be remembered that the cash payment is to be disposed of in the following manner to wit: Two dollars apiece to four Commissioners who acted making \$8.00 leaving a balance of \$17.00 which was paid over to the parties - Leam Bous, Wm Joyner, John Moore." On consideration whereof and by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the report aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid made be held firm and stable and be binding forever between the parties.
