This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed by the interlocutory decree made in this cause on the 15th day of December 1823 to make sale of the property therein mentioned this day made his report in the following words to wit. "In obedience to a decretal order of the County Court of Southampton pronounced at their December Court in the year 1823. in a suit in Chancery between Robert Goodwyn and Margaret his wife late Margaret B. Blou Complainants and Mary D. Blou widow of Henry Blou dec^d and Benjamin Blount Jr. surviving admor. with the will annexed of said Henry Blou dec^d and James Henry, and Robert, Blou infants and devisees of said Henry Blou dec^d the said James, Henry & Robert by John Thomas their next friend and the said Samuel by James Trezvant his next friend. The undersigned respectfully reports to the Court that he hath sold the land mentioned in the said order and such personal estate as was surrendered by the Defendant Mary D. Blou for that purpose. That the above named Robert Goodwyn who is the Guardian of the infant defendants became the purchaser of the same at \$7.25 per acre. that the land has been surveyed and found to contain seven hundred and twenty one acres. and that therefore the amount of the proceeds is \$5227.25. That the personal estate sold amounted to \$72.28 which hath been delivered over to the said Robert Goodwyn in right of his said wife and as Guardian to the infant defendants. These two sums added together makes the sum of \$5299.53 from which is to be deducted the sum of \$33.06 expences in surveying the said land and selling the same leaving a balance due at the respective times mentioned in said order of \$5266.87 which is in the hands of said Robert Goodwyn and to which the said Robert Goodwyn in right of his said wife and the said infant defendants to whom the said Robert Goodwyn is guardian are equally entitled. The undersigned further states that he hath made such a deed to the said Robert Goodwyn as by the said order he was directed. All which is submitted given under my hand this 1st day of May 1824. Benjamin Blount." Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered the said report
