Hight County and find the same to be done agreeable to contract. Aliz: the said James S.
Gwaltney is to receive fifty nine dollars and seventy five cents for righting up the bridge and
three dollars & three hundred for 3793 feet 4 inches of planks and scumming put on said bridge
making the sum of one hundred and seventy three dollars and fifty five cents to be paid by the
County of Southamptown and Isle of Wight. Given under our hands this 17th day of May 1824
Edwin Williford, Joseph Prellon."

On the motion of William Davis who made oath and together with Thomas Clifton
and Arthur Williamson his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of
two hundred and fifty dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted herefor obtain-
ing letters of administration on the estate of Henry C. Davis deceased in due form.

Ordered that the Overseers of the Poor for Saint Lukes parish take suit and place this
Beale and family on the poor list and make such allowance to them as may be necessary for their
support.
