By virtue of a decretal order of the Worshipful the County Court of Southampton to us directed and hereto annexed; we have proceeded to the division of the Estate of Frederick Parker dec^d. both real and personal and have allotted to his Widow Temperance Parker Lot N^o 4. To James W Parker Lot N^o 2. To Solomon D Parker Lot N^o 1. To Joseph H Parker Lot N^o 3 in the annexed Plat or Survey. After making a division of the Slaves in the most just and equitable manner we could, we allotted to Temperance Parker Lot N^o 4. To James W Parker N^o 2 to Solomon D Parker N^o 1 and to Joseph H Parker N^o 3 as well appear by reference to the annexed Statement containing a list of the names and value of each slave divided. We also proceeded to the appraisement of the remainder of the perishable estate of the aforesaid decedent, and found the whole amount to be Two thousand and thirty dollars & thirty five cents. of which amount we allotted one fourth part (say, \$507.58 1/4) to Temperance Parker one fourth part to James W Parker one fourth to Solomon D Parker & the remaining fourth to Joseph H Parker. In the division of the whole estate we find some inequality in each lot and for the purpose of doing it away we direct that Temperance Parker shall pay to Joseph fifty cents, James W Parker shall pay to Joseph seventy nine dollars & fifty cents, and that Solomon D Parker shall pay to Joseph
