A List of the Deeds &c. admitted to record in the Clerk's Office since the last Court by the Clerk, was this day returned, and examined by the Court and ordered to be entered among the minutes of the day.

Ordered that the Overseers of the Poor bind out Stephen H. Pikes son of Diego Pikes and Cherry Green according to Law.

Whitham Jones is by the Court allowed the sum of fifty dollars for keeping Jones ferry free from toll for this County from some Court last to some Court next. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County pay from that amount out of any contingent monies in his hands not otherwise appropriated, and account therefor according to Law.

For reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that Mathias Williams be summoned to the next Court to show cause if any he can why the Indentures binding Joel Royal to him should not be rescinded. And that the Overseers of the Poor take charge of the said Joel Royal until the further order of the Court.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Cobb examine, state and settle an account of Thomas Williamsons administration on the estate of Martha Williamson de'd and make report thereof to Court.

On the petition of Arthur Williamson setting forth that he is the owner of the lands on one side of the Southfork run of the three creeks in this County the middle of which Stream is the dividing line between the petitioner and Kerichen Williams, at a spot across which he wishes to erect a dam of sufficient height to raise the water three and a half feet on the bed of the said Stream, and to build a grist mill and machinery for other purposes which dam he wishes to erect from the said spot and about to the lands of Kerichen Williams. And it appearing to the Court that the said Kerichen Williams hath had ten days legal notice of this application he was solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is ordered that a writ of *ad quod damnum* be issued directed to the Sheriff of this County to be executed according to Law on the second Saturday in August next which writ together with the inquest to be taken in pursuance thereof is to be returned by the said Sheriff to the next Court.

A Receipt from Mary Ann L. Wilson to Leam Bowers was proved by the oaths of Jesse Lankford and William Lawrence the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

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
