In Chancery

This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed by the interlocutory decree made in this cause at January Court last to make division of the land and slaves therein mentioned this day made the following report to wit: "In obedience to an interlocutory decree Darden & against Hart, Britt & John pronounced at January Term by the County Court of S. Hampton in the year one thousand eight hundred & twenty four, and hereto annexed, We, your Commissioners have made a division of the tract of land and slaves in the decree mentioned, all of which proceedings and appropriations, we your Commissioners beg leave to report. The tract contains by actual survey, two hundred and fifty six acres: as represented in the annexed plat. Lot N^o 1 as represented in the annexed plat, containing 75 acres to William Elliott subject to the life estate of Ephraim Elliott; marked and bounded as follows - Beginning at a small Cypress standing in or near the edge of the tide water in Nottoway river and a few rods above the mouth of the mill swamp, thence S 21st W 13th p. to a post oak standing near the Kitchen, Corn Darden's corner, then S 34th W 8th p. to a Cherry tree, thence S 40th W 28th p. to a black gum a corner of said Darden, in Harrison's line then along the said Harrison's line S 63rd E 32nd p. to a pine, then N 65th E 32nd p. to a red oak, then N 52nd E 14th p. to a red oak, then N 65th E 14th p. to a pine, then N 31st E 11th p. to a Sweet gum in the mill swamp: then down said swamp the several courses thereof & bounded thereon 269 p. to Nottoway river above & thence to the beginning -

Lot N^o 2, as represented in the annexed plat, containing sixty acres, to Corn Darden in right of his wife Lucy marked and bounded as follows: Beginning at a Stake in Wm Elliott's line, thence S 63rd W 22nd p. to a Pear tree, then S 31st
