

N 280 p. to a black gum Benjamin Britt corner on W^m Harrison's. then along S^d Harrison's line S 63 E 52 p. to a black gum W^m Elliott's corner, thence along said Elliott's line N 40 E 28 p. to a cherry tree, then N 34 E 8 p. to the beginning -

Lot N^o 3. as represented in the annexed plat, containing one hundred & twenty one acres. To Benjamin Britt in right of his wife Elizabeth, marked and bounded as follows. Beginning at a small Cypress standing on Nottonay River as afores^d W^m Elliott's corner, thence out S 24 W 10 p. to a post, then S 63 W 22 p. to a pear tree in Carr Dardens line, thence S 50 W 28 p. to a black gum, said Dardens corner, then N 63 W 100 p. to a red oak, W^m Harrison's & Leon^d Elliott's corner, then N 50 E 105 p. to a large red oak, S^d Elliott's & J^m D. Hart's corner then S 50 E 80 p. to a pine tree, D. Hart's corner then N 25 E 172 p. to Nottonay river afores^d, then down said river 103 p. to the beginning; which we do adjudge having regard to quality as well as quantity, renders the divisions equal: all of which is submitted -

Your Worships in your decree hath farther ordered that we divide the slave allotted to the widow of the late Williams Hart dec^d into four equal parts, which we effected in the following manner.

Lot N^o 1. Negro man Jacob valued at \$308.33¹/₃ to the estate of Henry W. Hart dec^d which receives from N^o 2 the sum of \$41.66²/₃ & from N^o 3 \$8.33¹/₃ which makes the sum of \$358.33¹/₃ his proportional part -

Lot N^o 2. Negro man Morridge valued at \$400 to Ephraim Elliott in right of his wife Margaret from which deduct the sum of \$41.66²/₃ paid to N^o 1 leaves \$358.33¹/₃ his proportional part -

Lot N^o 3. Negro man Simon valued at \$375 to Carr Darden in right of his wife Lucy, from which deduct the sum of \$41.66²/₃ one equal moiety of which is paid to N^o 1 the other to N^o 4 leaves \$358.33¹/₃ his proportional part -

Lot N^o 4. Negroes Will & Harry valued at \$350. to Benjamin Britt in right of his wife Elizabeth to which sum add \$8.33¹/₃ received from N^o 3 making his proportional part the sum of \$358.33¹/₃ -

Your Commissioners then proceeded to sell the slave Jacob drawn by the estate of Henry W. Hart dec^d on a credit of 12 months, when Edmund Harrison became the purchaser for the sum of
