And the Court not being enabled to complete the examination of the prisoner to day, it is ordered that the said examination be adjourned till to morrow, and thereupon the prisoner is remanded to Jail.

Be it remembered that Charles R. Jenkins, James Austin, John Monack, Thomas Sance, Parthenia Thorp, Rowell Harrison, Benjamin Harrison, John A. Penson, Jesse Austin, Henry Battle, James Harrison, William Willford, Polly M. Lemore, Henry Bap, Shadrack Newton & Elias W. Pully here in Court severally acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Excellency James H. Hunt Esq. Governor of this Commonwealth and his Successors in Office for the term being in the sum of \$333.33 1/3 cents each of their respective goods and chattels, land & tenements to be levied, and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered.
