

Ordered that Henry Adams Alexander J. Jette. Edward Reese and Benjamin Lewis or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Amos Reese and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

Adam Sutcliffe late of the County of Southampton one parson of said County who stands charged with having on the 14th of February 1824 with force and arms at the County and parish aforesaid way laid and stabbed with some sharp instrument on the public highway Allen Beale with an intent in so doing to maim disfigure & kill him the said Allen Beale, was this day set to death in custody of the Sheriff of this County into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the felonious offence aforesaid (the Court summoned for his examination and having met) and thereupon divers witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises toward Allen Beale. Theophilus Joyner & Nathaniel Lehmann. The evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth as well as on behalf of the prisoner being closed and the prisoner being fully heard by Counsel. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner ought to be tried for the said offence at the next Superior Court to be holden for this County. And therefore it is ordered that he be removed to Jail.

Be it remembered that Adam Sutcliffe with Lawrence Oak, Charles McGowan, John Boykin and William Bryant his Securities here in Court acknowledged themselves indebted unto his Excellency James Pleasant Esq. Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth and his Successors in office for the time being, himself in the sum of three hundred dollars and his said Securities in the sum of seventy five dollars each of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Adam Sutcliffe shall personally appear before the Judge of the Superior Court of Law for Southampton County at the Court house on the first day of the next Term by ten O'clock of that day then and there to abide and perform the order or judgment of the said Court and shall not depart thence without leave of the Court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

Be it remembered that Allen Beale Theophilus Joyner and Nathaniel Lehmann here in Court acknowledged themselves indebted to his Excellency James Pleasant Esq. Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth and his Successors in office for the time being in the sum of \$333.33/3 cents each of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if they and each of them shall personally appear before the Judge of our Superior

Court of Law of this County on the first day of the next Term to give such evidence as they and each of them shall think proper against Adam Sutcliffe who stands charged with the offence aforesaid and shall not depart thence without leave of the said Court or else to remain in full force and virtue.

The petition and proceedings thereon for the building a water grist mill &c is continued till the next Term.

Ordered that Benjamin Griffin, Benjamin or any two of them examine state and settle and report the same to the Court.

Ordered that the Overseers of the poor provide for his support.

Malissa S. Bailey of the County of Southampton made choice of Philip B. Burt for her guardian together with James A. Bailey and John B. Burt and they acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars.

Purdy Bradshaw who is bound by recognizance the complaint of Tabitha Diles against him for in Court in discharge of his recognizance and thereupon examined and examined and the said Purdy Bradshaw Court and accordingly ordered that the said Purdy Bradshaw give the peace for the term of twelve months from the date of this order in the sum of One hundred dollars with two Securities. Whereupon the said Purdy Bradshaw together with his Securities here in Court severally acknowledged James Pleasant Esq. Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth and his Successors in office for the time being in the sum of One hundred dollars each of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Purdy Bradshaw shall personally appear before the Judge of our Superior Court on the first day of the next Term by ten O'clock of that day then and there to abide and perform the order or judgment of the said Court and shall not depart thence without leave of the Court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

Benjamin Barnes who is bound by recognizance the complaint of George Rayford against him for in Court in discharge of his recognizance and thereupon examined and examined and the said Benjamin Barnes Court and accordingly ordered that the said Benjamin Barnes give the peace for the term of twelve months from the date of this order in the sum of One hundred dollars with two Securities. Whereupon the said Benjamin Barnes together with his Securities here in Court severally acknowledged James Pleasant Esq. Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth and his Successors in office for the time being in the sum of One hundred dollars each of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements to be levied and to our said Governor and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Benjamin Barnes shall personally appear before the Judge of our Superior Court on the first day of the next Term by ten O'clock of that day then and there to abide and perform the order or judgment of the said Court and shall not depart thence without leave of the Court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
