

the Overseers of the poor of this County by a recognizance entered into at Southampton May Court 1841 by the Defendant with Ruben & John Whitehead as his security, made payable to the then Governor of Virginia and conditioned for the Defendant's payment to the Overseers of the Poor of six pounds annually for the space of ten years towards the support of an infant bastard child of Moses Soyner. And that the plaintiff also recover of the Defendant his costs by him in this behalf expended.

Ordered that the account of Charles W Goodwyn amounting to \$1.32 cents - The account of Arthur Middleton amounting to \$2.96 cents. The account of Thos. James amounting to \$3.84 cents be severally certified to the Auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment.

The Court doth assign Lawrence Cook guardian to Christian Gray orphan of Benjⁿ. Gray dec^d and thereupon the said Lawrence Cook together with Alexander Myrick his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned according to law.

Richard Darden is by the Court appointed Surveyor of the road from the swamp near Whiteheads meetinghouse to Natham Pops in the room of Henson Pops discharged and it is ordered that the usual hands do work thereon.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till Court in course -

The last will and Testament of William Ramsey dec^d was proved by the oath of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded, and Thomas Moore the Executor thereon named appeared in Court and refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof.
