By consent of parties and the report of the Court this cause was this day docketed and came on to be heard on the bill answer and other exhibits filed and was argued by Counsel. Whereupon it is adjudged, ordered and decreed that David Harrell, Edmund Willford, John Harris and Joseph Fulton or any three of them do divide the said slaves mentioned in the complainant's bill and deliver over to the complainants one full third part of the said slaves for and during the life of the complainant Patsy Coker late widow of W. S. Dalk dec'd and the other two thirds of said slaves divide into eight parts and allot to Willoughby W. Dalk one eighth part thereof and one eighth part Crighton by Dalk and deliver the same to Josiah Holloman their guardian. Allot one eighth to Saml M. Dalk & one eighth to Josiah D. M. Dalk and deliver the same to William Holloman their guardian. Allot one eighth to Wiley S. Dalk and deliver the same to Dawson Dalk his guardian. Allot one eighth to Margaret E. Dalk, one eighth to Patsy W. Dalk and the other eighth to Winty A. Dalk absolutely and deliver the same to Joseph Coker their guardian and in case the plaintiffs or guardians refuse to pay such difference in value as may be estimated by the said Commissioners then one or more of the said negroes shall be sold to effect such division after giving reasonable notice of the time and place of sale. And finally it is ordered that such of them as may act do make a report to this Court in order to a final decree.

On the motion of Brittain Williams who filed his bill against Jesse Stephenson representing that the said James Stephenson designs quickly to leave the Commonwealth which will tend to the great prejudice and damage of the said Brittain Williams. Therefore it is ordered that a writ of Habeas Corpus be awarded to prevent the said James Stephenson from departing this Commonwealth or to oblige him to give bond Security in the penalty of One hundred dollars to answer such decree as shall hereafter be made by this Court in this suit. But the plaintiff is not to have the benefit of this order until he shall enter into bond with security in the Office of this Court in the penalty of One hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs.
