This day came the parties by their counsel and Robert Gordon one of the Commissioners appointed by the interlocutory decree made in this cause at November Term 1821, to make division and sale of the slaves therein mentioned this day made the following report. "Southampton County to wit: In conformity to the within decree directed to Richard Blunt, William Phillips, Saml Harris and myself finding it impracticable to make ~~full~~ equal division of the slaves within mentioned among the parties, after giving due notice of the time and place, proceeded to sell the slaves as aforesaid for the sum of \$1787.80 - which sum after deducting the necessary expenses has been paid over by me (the other acting Commissioners Richard Blunt and William Phillips having departed this life) to the several legacies (as directed by the within decree and an order made at May Term 1821) whose several receipts are made a part of this
