Therefore it is ordered that they severally appear here and answer the Complainants original and amended bills filed in their causes on or before the third Monday in February next, and that a copy of this order be forthwith inserted in the Petersburg Intelligencer for eight weeks successively and posted at the front door of the Court house of this County on two several Court days.
