This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed to carry into effect the interlocutory decree made in this cause at March Term 1823 this day made the following report to wit.

Agreeably to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date March Court 1823 and herewith annexed we have after giving public notice as directed by said decree, of the time and place of sale, proceeded to sell at public auction to the highest bidder the land and slaves whereof John Boykin (son of Daniel, dec^d seized and possessed of, on a credit of twelve months, and taken bonds and security for the same and have paid the bonds over to David I. Boykin the adm^r: as directed in said decree, and have taken his receipt for the same, which is annexed to this report. Given under our hands the 8th day of April 1824. Silas Summerell, Arthur Holliman John Boykin."

The Commissioners heretofore appointed under the former interlocutory decree in this cause having reported to the Court that they had effected the sale of the land and slaves in that decree mentioned and had turned over the bonds to the Defendant David I. Boykin as administrator of John Boykin dec^d but had not proceeded to make the several divisions and allotments indicated in the said decree: and it appearing proper to the Court on mature examination of the cause that the accounts of the said David I. Boykin's administration on the said estate
