examination of Sarah Jones who stands charged with stealing tailors ~~tailor~~ carrying away on the night  
of the eleventh of February last past from the field plow of John Booth one pair of Iron Traces of  
the value of 87<sup>1/2</sup> cents

The court being thus constituted the prisoner was set to the bar by the Sheriff of this county  
into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the felony aforesaid and thereupon  
several witnesses were deposed & examined on behalf of the court touching the premises & John  
Booth, Silas Bay & Henry Booth - and the prisoner being fully heard by court - The court  
after hearing the testimony & all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner ought  
to be tried for said offence at the next Superior court to be held for this county & Southampton  
it is ordered that he be remanded to jail -

Be it remembered that John Booth, Silas Bay & Henry Booth here in court acknowledged themselves  
invited into his Excellency James Pendarves Esq; Governor of this colony & his successor in office for the time
