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 At a court of Oyer & Terminer summoned & held for the county of Southampton on the 21st of June 1824 for the trial of ^{James D. Moseburg} a negro man, slave the property of James H. Schell of this county charged with stealing & carrying away the money of said James H. Schell of the property of Humphrey Drew, Pres. James D. Moseburg, Mrs. Briggs, James Mayrick, James W. Parker & Robert Goodwyn Gent.
 The court being this appointed the prisoner was this day set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this county and charged with the offence aforesaid, and being thereof arraigned, upon his arraignment pleaded not guilty and for his trial put himself upon his god & his country, and thereupon seven witnesses were sworn & examined on behalf of the com^{ty}. Touching the premises to wit, Humphrey Drew, Thomas Britton & others and the prisoner being fully heard by court. The court after hearing the testimony & all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is guilty and therefore it is ordered that he be burnt in the hands and receive thirty nine lashes well laid on and that the Sheriff of this county see execution thereof & the same being done & performed, a proclamation being made in the manner is & making further being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged. Ordered that ~~John B. Mason~~ be allowed Eight Dollars for finding the prisoner in this case.

Britton James is by the Court allowed the sum of fifty dollars for keeping Jones Ferry free from toll for this County from June last to June Court next and that the Sheriff of this County pay him that sum out of any Contingent money in his hand not otherwise appropriated and account therefor according to Law.

Ordered that Matthias Williams be summoned to the next Court to show Cause why the indentures binding Joel Dayal to him should not be revoked, and that the overseers of the Poor take charge of the said Joel Dayal, until the further order of the Court.
