The noncupative will of Benj^a White dec. was presented in court in the following words to wit: Memorandum - Me the undersigned subscribers went to Mr. Benj^a White on Thursday morning last and found him very ill, so ill that he said he wanted to make a will, and sent for Mr. M. L. Brattle for that purpose, but he did not come until it was too late during which time he called on us to take notice, that his will was that his wife should have all his estate of every description whatever, to dispose of in any way she might think proper except his negro man Nero who he wished to leave free at her death if the law would permit him to stay here & be free but if not he wished her to have him & dispose of him - also in any manner she might think proper, he observed that the reason why he wished to make a will, was that if he did not his relations w^d come in and interfere his wife - his son-in-law or hand this 9th day of October 1824 - George Branch, Sally ^{her} Branch - signed and sworn to before me by George Branch and Polly his wife this 9th day of October 1824 Silas Sumner - whereupon the said George Branch & Polly Branch were at once
