 the house and go to bed; The prisoner refused unless the witness would permit her to go in too, he
 this deponent refused to go in myself by himself and asked her to make a fire in the kitchen, so
 the prisoner said she was afraid, Then deponent then went away - The husband of the sec^d
 had gone to Norfolk and there was no person on the premises except the deceased, the prisoner and
 a child of three year old further this deponent said not -
 William Davis of full age being first sworn on the holy evangelist of almighty God deponeth
 saith that he with others after understanding that Mr. Shields was ~~murdered~~ missing, went in
 search of her, that they went in the house of John Shields the husband of the sec^d and found the
 floor blooey, with lime thereon over it, and after searching some time discovered the sign of some
 thing being dragged which extended from near the house to the spot where the body of the sec^d
 was found, buried under some logs and further this deponent saith not

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
