Hall a negro man slave (the property of Benjⁿ Turner of this county) who stands charged
with murdering a negro man Harry (the property of James Jackson of this county) on the night
of the 8th of December 1826 was this day set to the bar by the Sherriff of this county into
whose custody he was heretofore committed and being thereof arraigned upon his arraignment
pleaded not guilty and for his trial put himself upon God and this court and thereupon seven
witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the cond. Touching the premises to wit, shall
a negro man slave the property of James Harrison, Cherry a negro woman slave the property
of Benjⁿ Turner, Joseph S. Blair, Auburn Middleton, James Jackson & Benjⁿ Turner
and the prisoner being fully heard by counsel - The court after hearing the testimony
and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is guilty of man-
slaughter and therefore is entitled to the benefit of clergy - Therefore it is ordered that he
receive thirty nine lashes on his bare back with rods or and be burnt in the hand, and
it is ordered that the Sherriff of this county see execution thereof done, and the same being
done and performed and proclamation being made as the manner is & nothing further app-
earing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged from
further prosecution in this behalf
