 Ordered that Robert Goodwyn Pres. let W. Goodwyn sent Anthony a negro man slave the property of William Vick of this county who stands charged with feloniously and burglariously breaking and entering into the kitchen of Nancy Neumann and breaking and entering one safe the property of Josiah Barnes in the possession of the said Nancy Neumann on or about the 28th day of January 1827 and stealing taking away about four yards of cotton cloth, one pair Shavers, and one box containing about Ten pounds of Lard and about Three pounds of Sausages, was this day set to the bar by the Sheriff of this county into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the felony aforesaid, and being thereof arraigned and upon his arraignment pleases not guilty and for his trial put himself upon God and this Court (The Court of Oyer & Terminer Summoned for his trial not having met) and Edwin Dalk being assigned counsel for the prisoner, thereupon came divers witnesses who being sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises to wit, Nancy Neumann, Joseph Pymon, Lydia Adams and W. C. Butler. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is guilty of the larceny whereof he stands charged. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the prisoner be burnt in the hand and receive thirty nine lashes on his bare back and that the Sheriff of this county see execution thereof done and the same being done and proclamation being made at the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against the prisoner it is ordered that he be forthwith discharged from further prosecution in this behalf.

Ordered that Edwin Dalk be allowed the sum of Ten Dollars for his services in defending the aforesaid negro man Anthony & that William Vick pay the same

Ordered that Charles Magazet qualified as deputy of a Justice of the Peace of this county according to law

Ordered that Jacob Barnes & Edwin Vick settle an additional acct. with Nicholas Robertson

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
