On the petition of Alldredge Jones, setting forth that he is the proprietor of the land on one side of Mottoway River at the place called & known by the name of Jones Ferry. And praying that a writ of Ad-quod-dammum be awarded him directing the Sheriff to ^{summon a jury} go on the premises and lay out and circumscribe by proper metes & bounds one acre of land on the opposite side to land his boat, and to say whether in their opinion the public convenience will be ~~be~~ result from the establishment of such ferry - Therefore it is ordered that the writ of Ad-quod-dammum be awarded him commanding the Sheriff to summon a good & lawful jury of freeholders to go on the premises on the 15. day of August next & lay out one acre of land as aforesaid & say whether in their opinion the public convenience will result from the establishment of such ferry.
