



356 • Fugitive & Larceny negro men slaves the property of Edwin Pickles of this county were brought into court by the Sheriff of this county into whose custody they were heretofore committed and charged with feloniously on the 24th of January 1829 about the hour of 12 O'clock in the night of the same day with force and arms at the parish of Stottoway in the county of Southampton the dwelling house of Henry Briggs there situated feloniously and Burglariously did break & enter with intent the goods & chattels of the said Henry Briggs in the said dwelling house then and there being then and there feloniously & Burglariously to steal take and carry away & then and there with force and arms two barrels of Brandy of the value of Thirty Dollars, and a quantity of Brandy of the value of ~~the value~~ ^{to wit} Thirty gallons of Brandy of the value of Thirty Dollars, one parcel of Leather, & three wallets of the value of Ten Dollars of the property of the said Henry Briggs in the same dwelling house then and there being found then and there feloniously and Burglariously did steal take and carry away and that they did on the said 24th of January 1829 at the parish and county aforesaid with force and arms feloniously did break a Store house then & there being belonging to and used as such by the said Henry Briggs & then & there did feloniously take therefrom steal & carry away goods, chattels wares and merchandise of the value of Four Dollars to wit One barrel of Brandy of the value of \$30 and Thirty gallons of Brandy of the value of Thirty Dollars and a piece of Leather & three wallets of the value of Ten Dollars - and being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty and for their Trial put themselves upon god and this court (The court summoned for their Trial not having met) and thereupon given witnesses were sworn & examined on behalf of the count Touching the premises to wit Henry Briggs, Saml. Briggs & others - The court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoners are guilty of Larceny, Therefore it is ordered that they ^{be burnt in the hand} receive 39 lashes on his bare back to well laid on, and that the Sheriff see execution thereof done, and the same being done and performed and proclamation being made in the manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against them it is ordered that they be forthwith discharged

Joe, Jacob & Jack negro men slaves the property of Bramly Bell of this county were brought into court by the Sheriff of this county into whose custody he was heretofore committed & charged with breaking and entering the house of Henry Briggs of this county & thereout steal and take and carry away a certain quantity of Brandy of the value of Thirty Dollars, and three wallets of the value of Ten Dollars on the night of 24th of January last (and being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty and for their Trial put them upon god and this court (The court summoned for their examination not having met) and thereupon given witnesses were sworn & examined on behalf of the count Touching the premises to wit Henry Briggs & others, The court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoners are

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guilty of Larceny, ^{therefore} laid on & be burnt in the hand, and the same manner is and nothing further appearing or being alleged against them it is ordered that they be forthwith discharged
