

Nathaniel Jones the proprietor of certain lands in the said County, through which a certain Rail Road Company called and styled "The Portsmouth and Roanoke Rail Road Company" propose to open a Rail Road do hereby certify that we met together on the lands aforesaid, on the 20th day of June in the year 1835 being the day to which we were regularly adjourned from the day appointed for our meeting by the said order, and that having first been duly sworn, and having viewed the premises we proceeded to estimate the quantity and quality of the lands aforesaid, which would be occupied by said road; the quantity of additional fencing and gates which would probably be occasioned thereby, and all other inconveniences which seemed to us likely to result therefrom to the said land; that we combined with these considerations as far as we could, a just regard to the advantages which would be derived by the proprietor of the said land, from the opening of the aforesaid Rail Road through the same, that under the influence of these considerations, we have estimated and do hereby affirm the damages aforesaid, at the sum of Two hundred and twenty five dollars extending from the line of John Turner to the other end of John Turner in the direction of the Rail Road and bisected by the said Rail Road, containing about five acres - one hundred feet in width - Given under our hands and seals this twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty five - John D. Parker, Esq. Peter Edwards Esq. Wm. H. Nicholson Esq. Nath. J. Williams Esq. Lewis Horrell Esq. Clements Rockelle Esq. Justices of the Peace for said County do hereby certify, that the above named freeholders, before they executed their duties, as above specified, were solemnly sworn before me that they would impartially and justly to the best of their ability, ascertain the damages which would be sustained by the above named Nathaniel Jones from the opening of the above mentioned Rail Road through his lands, and that they would certify truly their proceedings thereupon, to the Court of the said County. Given under my hand this twenty ninth day of June 1835.

On the motion of the President and Directors of the Portsmouth and Roanoke Rail Road Company against John E. Deale. The Commissioners or valuers appointed in this cause under an order of the Court made at Term Term 1835 this day made their report appraising the damages of the Defendant at the sum of Two hundred dollars; and he being solemnly called came not and there being no objection made thereto, the said report as by the Court affirmed and ordered to be recorded. And in the following words to wit: "We Solomon D. Parker, Peter Edwards, Wm. H. Nicholson, Nath. J. Williams and Lewis Horrell freeholders appointed by an order of the County Court of Southampton for the purpose of ascertaining the damages which would be sustained by John E. Deale the proprietor of certain lands in the said County through which a certain Rail Road Company called and styled "The Portsmouth and Roanoke Rail Road Company" propose to open a Rail Road do hereby certify that we met together on the land aforesaid on the 29th day of June in the year 1835, being the day appointed for our meeting by the said order and that having been first duly sworn and having viewed the premises, we proceeded to estimate the quantity and quality of the lands aforesaid which would be occupied by said road; the quantity of additional fencing and gates which would probably be occasioned thereby, and all other inconveniences which seemed to us likely to result therefrom to the said land; that we combined with these considerations as far as we could, a just regard to the advantages which would be derived by the proprietor of the said land from the opening of the aforesaid Rail Road through the same, that under the influence of these considerations we have estimated, and do hereby affirm the damages aforesaid at the sum of Two hundred dollars for the land from the line of Mary Drake & others to the line of John D. Parker & others one hundred feet in width and bisected by the Rail Road containing Eight acres and a half more or less - Given under our hands and seals this twenty ninth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five.
