Sworn and having viewed the premises, we proceeded to estimate the quantity and quality of the lands
 aforesaid, which would be occupied by said road, the quantity of additional fencing and gates which
 would probably be occasioned thereby, and all other inconveniences which seemed to us likely to result therefrom
 to the said land, that we combined with these considerations as far as we could, a just regard to
 the advantages which would be derived by the proprietor of the said land from the opening of the
 aforesaid Rail Road through the same, that under the influence of these considerations, we have
 estimated and do hereby assess the damages aforesaid at the sum of One hundred and ten dollars
 for the land extending from the Northway River to the land of Mary Drake & others contained
 feet in width and bisected by the said Rail Road. Containing Eleven acres more or less -
 Given under our hands and Seals this twenty ninth day of June in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and thirty five - J. C. Parker. *Just.* Peter Edwards *Just.* J. H. H.
 Nicholas *Just.* J. A. Williams *Just.* Lewis Worrell *Just.*
 County of Southampton to wit: J. Clements Rockelle a Justice of the Peace for said
 County do hereby certify that the above named freeholders before they executed their duties as
 above specified were solemnly sworn before me that they would impartially and justly to the
 best of their ability ascertain the damages which would be sustained by the above named
 James Rockelle from the opening of the above mentioned Rail Road through his lands, and that
 they would certify truly their proceedings to the Court of the said County. Given under my hand
 this 29th day of June A.D. 1835 -

 sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Julia

This day came the parties by their counsel and the Commissioners appointed by an interlocutory decree
 made in this cause at March Court 1835 to make sale of the lands of which Reuben Sawyer and Rebecca
 Sawyer his wife died seised, this day made their report in the following words to wit: Pursuant to the
 above decree, the undersigned Commissioners have sold the above named land to the highest bidder,
 and the same was purchased by John Dandabon for fifty two dollars and twenty five cents, we the Com-
 missioners find that there is one of the infant children not named in the above decree a child of
 Reuben Sawyer named Lucy there being eight legacies we have taken the bonds and divided accord-
 ingly \$32.25.
