

believed that the very persons most anxious in some instances for a new road have not made the application but procured the same to be made and then serve as Commissioners, there consequently is little danger of an unfavorable report. Note that your Commissioners could improve the motives of any persons or doubt that the Commissioners in their oath will and heretofore have acted in perfect good faith but when all the wishes and prejudices of individuals are enlisted they are apt to take a one sided view and consequently with a pure heart and a clear conscience come to very erroneous conclusions. Your Commissioners are therefore convinced that more correct information may be frequently obtained from persons not named in the order. All of which is respectfully submitted. J. D. And it is further ordered that the proprietors of the land through which the said road is to run be summoned to the next court to show cause if any they can why the said road should not be opened as proposed.

This day came the parties by their Attornies who being fully heard and the evidence adduced maturely considered it seems to the Court that there is no error in the judgment aforesaid. Therefore it is considered that the same be affirmed, and that the appellee recover against the appellant and David D. Savage his security, the amount thereof together with ten per centum for annual damages thereon from the aforesaid 14th day of March 1835 till payment, and his costs by him about his defence in this behalf expended.
