The Court proceeded to elect a Clerk to supply the vacancy created by the death of James
Rockelle Esquire, late Clerk of this Court, and upon taking the vote of the Court viva voce Littleton
R. Edwards was unanimously elected. Whereupon the said Littleton R. Edwards was declared duly
elected Clerk of this Court for the term of seven years next ensuing, and thereupon the said Littleton
R. Edwards together with Augustin Labonne, Edwards Butts, John V. Masson and Samuel W. Hines
his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned
as the law directs which bond is ordered to be recorded. The said Littleton R. Edwards also took
the oath of fidelity to the Commonwealth, the oath to support the Constitution of the United States,
the oath against duelling and the oath of Office -

Southampton held at the Courthouse on Monday the 19th of October 1835, Colo. Augustin Labonne was
called to the Chair and Jeremiah Cobb Esq. was appointed Secretary -

On motion of John V. Masson - Resolved that this meeting has learned with deep sorrow the death
of James Rockelle, late Clerk of the Courts of this County - that having performed the duties of that
office for more than twenty years, with fidelity and integrity, and having through a long life filled
his station public and private, with exemplary propriety, we take a melancholy pleasure in bear-
ing our testimony to his exalted worth, and in expressing our respect for his memory -

Resolved, that we sympathize with his amiable family in the melancholy dispensation of Providence
Resolved that the County Court be respectfully requested to meet the proceedings of this meeting
