

Ordered that James D. Masseyburg, James M. Lough and John Davis being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of Edmund Riches deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On motion of James W. Parker for leave to alter the road near his house. Ordered that Henry B. Laughlin, Thomas Reddy & Benjamin Lamb being sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, view the way proposed for said road to run as well as the present way and report to the Court the comparative conveniences and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public of such alteration be made as proposed.

On the motion of Jesse Parker who made oath and together with David D. Savage his security entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of three hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Jackson Gardner deceased in due form.

Ordered that Master Commissioner Collier examine and settle an account of Jesse Parker's administration on the estate of Jackson Gardner deceased and report the same to the Court with any matters specially stated deemed pertinent by himself or which he may be required to state.

An Inventory and Appraisement of the estate of Willis Bowers deceased was this day returned and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that Benjamin Griffin, being first duly sworn for that purpose, be appointed Commissioner to State settle and adjust an account of the administration on Willis Bowers estate and report the same to the Court. A Writing bearing date the 26th day of July 1832 purporting the last Will and Testament of Aubin Middleton deceased was produced in Court, and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, John H. Moser and John M. Gurley were severally sworn who deposed and swears that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the said Aubin Middleton and verily believe that the body of the said writing as well as the signature thereto to be in the hand writing of the said Aubin Middleton and the Court being thereof satisfied it was ordered that the said writing be recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of the said Aubin Middleton deceased. And James Rochelle one of the executors being dead, Benjamin Middleton another executor being out of the County, and Sarah Middleton the executrix and George L. Bay the other executor, refusing to take upon themselves the burden of the execution of the said Will. On the motion of Nathaniel Williams who made oath and together with Lewis Morrell and Sampson C. Reese his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Aubin Middleton deceased with his Will annexed in due form.

Ordered that Septima Darden, Sampson LeRue, William Bryant and John Reed or any three of them being first duly sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal and real estate of Aubin Middleton deceased in this County which may be to them produced or shown and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.

On the motion of John D. Turner for leave to open a new road commencing at Mr. Benjamin Turners at Hawks Bridge road and running by Jesse I. West's by Nathaniel Jones, through James Jacksons land by William Coyner across the Rail Road or Edmund Turners land to the lower corner of Mr. Branches Suters plantation to the State line. Ordered that Nathaniel Jones, Henry More, Richard Mason, and Jesse I. West or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do view the way proposed for the said road and report to the Court the conveniences and inconveniences that will result as well to individuals as to the public if such road be opened as proposed.

On the motion of Margaret Milner who made oath and together with William D. Nelson and Thomas A. Story her securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs, certificate is granted her for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of John Ferguson deceased in due form.

Ordered that Alfred Story, John Hargrave and Nancy Hazet being sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose do appraise all the personal estate of John Ferguson deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to Court.
