And that the clerk out of that amount pay to George Camp administrator of Thomas Camp dec.
the sum of Eighty dollars and thirteen cents being the amount which is due him as appears from
Master Commissioner Lebb's report of his Administration account from the infant children of
James Blythe - and that the clerk pay to Can Broun Commissioner of Martha & Fanny Blythe
two deceased children of James Blythe the two thirds of the balance and return the remaining
four thirds of said balance subject to the order of the Guardian hereafter to be appointed of
the surviving children of James Blythe -

On the motion of James D. Maysburg for leave to open a new road. The Commissioners
heretofore appointed to view the way proposed for said road to run this day made their report
which is ordered to be recorded and is in the words following to wit: "We the undersigned
Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Southampton at the October Term 1835 have
proceeded to examine the route for opening a new road designated by the annexed order viz
"Connecting the road leading from Monroe to Black Creek and road leading by Atterbury
Chapel to Jerusalem leaving the former road at or near Taiton W. Scott's and to intersect
with the latter at the path leading to Alfred Rich's" The proposed road will run over the
lands of James Scott, Kinchen Tynes, March Howell and Benjamin West, Jesse Blythe
and Molly Drake all of whom are very willing for it to run over their lands. Therefore
your Commissioners are of opinion that to establish the said road no inconvenience what-
ever can result either to the public or to individuals. We moreover concur in opinion
that if the above named road should be opened and established as a public highway
that it will be a great convenience to the public as well as to individuals. All of which is
respectfully submitted - October 27, 1835. Benj. Quincy, Alfred Richs, Taiton W. Scott."
And it appearing to the Court from the said report that the proprietors of the land through
which the said road is to run have given their consent to the same. It is ordered that the
petitioners have leave to open the said road as proposed.

Ordered that John Denigre, Peter Pierce, William D. Ford and Gilbert Nick or any
three of them let the lowest undertaker the rebuilding of Colliers mill bridge, the Caspene
Bridge and the Village Bridge, that they receive the same when completed and make
report thereof to Court.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next Term.
