This day came the parties by their Counsel and the Commissioners appointed by the Interlocutory decree made in this cause at March Court 1855 to make division of the slaves therein mentioned the day made the following report to wit: "In obedience to a decree of the County Court of Southampton bearing date March Court 1855

the undersigned Commissioners have divided the slaves belonging to the estate of the late Daniel Dells dec'd in the following manner. April 14/1855

Edmund \$25.00 Robt \$200.00 Brandon \$550.00 James 500.00 = 1275.00

Amos 475.00 Alfred 175.00 Elany 250.00 Liza 450.00 Roger \$175.00 = 1525.00

Wick of no value Amy of no value

Actual valuation \$2800.00

4 distributees Henry M. Dells Francis P. Dells & George H. Dells \$700 each

They then divided the above slaves in the following lots.

Lot No 1. Brandon \$550.00 Lot No 2. James \$500.00

Alfred 175.00 Roger 175.00

Francis P. Dells \$725.00 Henry M. Dells \$675.00

Lot No 3. Amos 475.00 Lot No 4. Liza 450.00

Elany 250.00 Robt 200.00

George Dells \$725.00 Edmund 25.00

Edward A. Dells \$675.00

When the lots No 1, 2, 3 & 4 were drawn in the following order. No 1 was drawn by Francis P. Dells who gives to Henry M. Dells who drew lot No 2 \$25. No 3 drawn by George Dells who pays lot No 4 drawn by Edward A. Dells \$25. The old negro woman Wick and Amy of no value by consent were taken by Henry M. Dells. All of which is respectfully submitted to the court. Edward A. Dells, Robert H. Hargreaves, William Seligman, Comrs. Whereupon by consent of parties it is decreed and ordered that the division aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid made be held firm and stable and binding forever between the parties and that the cost of this suit be equally borne between the said parties.
