A Responding bond from Mary Powell, Charlotte Powell, John Powell, Thaddeus Powell, Jesse Roe and Thomas Powell to Clements Michelle late Sheriff and Committee of the estate of Thaddeus Powell dec'd was sworn by the oath of William S. Seibell the witness thereto and ordered to be recorded.

By consent It is ordered that the license heretofore granted to Samuel Kello to keep an ordinary in this County till Mary Court next be transferred to Arthur Drury according to Law, upon his entering into bond with security as the Law directs the Court being of opinion that the said Drury is a man of good character and is not addicted to drunkenness or gaming.

Charles C. Brattle is appointed Surveyor of the road called Chappel Road, from Croffards road to Darons road in the town of Burnell four removed and it is ordered that the usual bonds do walk thereon.
