Linscott of the Commonwealth of Virginia, discharging the functions of Governor in the sum of one hundred dollars of his Lands and tenements and of chattels to be held and to the said Linscott Governor and his deputies in office for the use of the Commonwealth returned. But upon this condition, of the said Linscott Governor shall personally appear before the Justice of the Peace for this County at the Court house on the first day of the next Court and give such evidence as he knows on behalf of the Commonwealth against Miller Johnson who stands charged with felony, and shall not absent himself without leave of the Court then this recognizance is to be and is to remain in full force.
