

Present Jeremiah Cobb - Absent Joseph T. Clark & Saml Dwyer.

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The Court upon consideration doth adopt the plan for a Jail recommended by the Commission-
ers in their Report, with this exception that the logs on the sides be splined at the parti-
tion, and that the Jail should not be enclosed by the wall as the former one. And it is
ordered that the Commissioners who reported the said plan or any three or more of them do
after giving reasonable notice thereof, let to the lowest undertaker, the building of the Jail
upon the plan recommended, with the exception before made take bonds with good security
of the undertaker, conditioned for the performance of the contract, and when the same is
completed receive the same and make report thereof to Court. And the Court doth further
order that the aforesaid Commissioners, together with William S. Sparks or any three or more
of them as aforesaid do advise some plan and let to the lowest undertaker, the enclosure
of the Public Square which letting is to be subject to the approval or rejection of the
next Court & which letting may be made in connection with, or separate from the Jail as to
the Commissioners may seem proper.

Ordered that Jeremiah Cobb be authorized to take down the brick Wall of the old Jail and to
take care of the clay iron & other materials belonging to the said Jail for which the said
Cobb will be allowed a reasonable compensation for his services or trouble, and that the said
Cobb be also authorized to use four thousand of the said bricks for which he will be answer-
able for their true value.
