

The commissioners appointed at November Court 1835 to let to the lowest undertaker the rebuilding of Mill Bridge, the Cassinua Bridge and the Village Bridge, this day made the following Report which is confirmed and ordered to be recorded. "In compliance with an order of the County Court of Southampton, issued at November Term 1835, for the letting of the repairs of the Cassinua, Village and Old Mill Bridges. We Peter S. Stone, Gilbert Tuck and William L. Hood, three of the commissioners therein named, on examination of the same, came to the conclusion that the entire rebuilding was necessary, and put them up accordingly, with the express injunction that the best least tender only, should be made; Major Geo. Tuck became the undertaker, for of 103 1/2 to wit, for the Cassinua Bridge \$33 - for the Village Bridge \$15.50 - and for the old Mill Bridge \$55 - the whole to be completed by March Court last, which has, on his part, been fully complied with, and to the satisfaction of the acting Commissioners, whom they make this their Report, with all due deference to the Court." Peter S. Stone, Gilbert Tuck W. L. Hood. June 11th 1836"
