Seanties in the sum of \$60 each, of their respective goods & chattels, lands & tenements to be
bribe an to the said Governor & his successors for the use of the Commonwealth render-
ed. It is upon this condition that if the said Abington Edwards shall personally appear before
the Commonwealth Justice of the Peace for this County at the Court house on the morrow
morning by eleven o'clock to stand his trial for the offence of which he stands of which
he stands charged and shall not depart thence without leave of the said Court then
this Recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force.

In motion of Thomas B. Merrill, one of the Executors named in the Will of Cherry Bial
decd., who made oath, and together with Alexander Myrick and Lewis Merrill his Associates
entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five thousand dollars conditioned
as the Law directs. Certificate in guarantee him for obtaining a probat of said Will in
due form. Peter Edwards the other executor named in the said Will, appeared in Court,
and refused to take upon himself any part of the burden of the execution thereof.

Ordered that Davis Barrett, Nancy Maget, Miles Story & John Nelson or any three
of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, do ap-
praise all the personal estate of Cherry Bial decd. and return the appraisement un-
der their hands to this Court.

A Deed of bargain & sale from Richard L. Thomas & Sarah R. his Wife and James Thomas
to Willis M. Lawrence, Mary Benson & George M. Lawrence was proved by the oath of Joseph
Pinto, Jacob H. Duck and William D. Hoages witnesses thereto, and together with the
certificate annexed of the prior examination and acknowledgment of said Sarah R. Thomas
ordered to be recorded.

A Deed of bargain & sale Thomas R. Gray, Commissioner, to Clements Rockelle was acknowledged
by said Thomas R. Gray, and ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that John Maguham, James D. Massenburg, Carr Bowers, Joseph T. Haud John Moore
Henry R. Vaughan & Samuel Drewry or a Majority of them, do examine the Court House
of this County and report whether the same has been completed according to contract.

A Reports of provisioning in precincts No 26, 18 &c were returned and ordered to
be recorded.

The Commissioners appointed at April Court 1835 to let to the lowest undertaker the
repairs of the Bridge across the Cypress Swamp near John D. Hart, this day made the
following report, which was confirmed by the Court, and ordered to be recorded. "In ob-
edience to the unrevoked order of the undersigned two of your Honor. dat of the 9th
day of Sept. last proceeded to let to the lowest undertaker the bridge across Cypress Swamp
near John D. Hart, when James Maget became the lowest bidder at the sum of one hundred
and seventeen dollars and 50/100. Said bridge to be built by November 1st following. Also at
the same time we sold up at the highest bidder the timbers of the old bridge when John
D. Hart became the purchaser at the sum of four dollars & 70 cents now due the County.
We, your Honor, have examined the bridge above let and find it completed in all respects
agreeable to contract." Clements Rockelle, John D. Hart."
