

An Indenture of bargain and sale from David Johnson to Mills S. Gray was acknowledged by said Johnson and ordered to be recorded.

The Last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Mills decd was proved by the oath of Emily S. Mills and Susanna Turner the witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on motion of Allen Edwards the only executor therein named, who made oath and together with Joshua Miley and Joseph Seneca his servants, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

Ordered that Patrick Reave, William Harris, John Edwards & William Davis or any three of them, being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace for that purpose, do appear all the personal estate of Elizabeth Mills decd and return the appraisement under their hands to this Court.

John H. Felt who stands bound by recognizance for his appearance here this day to answer the complaint of John Bains for a breach of the Peace appeared accordingly and the said Bains being sworn & examined and the said Felt fully heard. It is the opinion of the Court that the said Felt give security for keeping the Peace for 12 months. Whereupon the said John H. Felt together with Edwards Butts & Samuel B. Hines, his securities here in Court acknowledged themselves indebted to Nathaniel Robertson Esq. Lieutenant Governor & acting as Governor of the Commonwealth, the said Felt in the sum of \$50 and the said securities in the sum of \$25 each of their respective goods & chattels lands & tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth to render. But upon this condition that if the said Felt shall keep the Peace & be of good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth more especially towards John Bains for the term of twelve months from this day then this recognizance to be void.

Johnson Pope and Samuel Joyner having been guilty of an affray in the Court House during the sitting of the Court, were brought into Court. Whereupon it is ordered that they severally give security for keeping the Peace for the term of twelve months from this day, the said Pope to be bound in the sum of \$50 with 4 securities in the sum of \$12.50 each; and the said Joyner in the like sum of \$50 with three securities in the sum of \$16.66 2/3 cents each. And thereupon the said Johnson Pope together with Jacob Williams, his securities here in Court severally acknowledged themselves to be indebted to Nathaniel Robertson Esq. Lieutenant Governor and acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Pope in the sum of Fifty dollars, and the said securities in the sum of \$12.50 each of their respective goods & chattels lands & tenements to be levied and to the said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth to render. But upon this condition, if the said Pope shall keep the Peace & be of good behaviour towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth for the term of 12 months from this day then the above recognizance to be void. And the said Samuel Joyner together with Calvin Gardner, Arrington Gardner and to Nathaniel Robertson Esq. Lieutenant Governor & acting as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia the said Joyner in the sum of \$50 and his said securities in the sum of \$16.66 2/3 cents each of their respective goods & chattels lands & tenements to be levied and to the said Governor & his successors for the use of the Commonwealth to render. But upon this condition of the

said Joyner shall keep the Peace for the term of 12 months from this day.
