

At a Court of Quarterly Sessions continued and held for the County of Southampton on the 21st day of June 1836.

The Commissioners appointed at April Court 1836, to confer with such Commissioners as had been appointed by the County Court of Newsum in respect to the enlargement of the draw-arch in the Bridge at South Quay, made the following report which is approved of by the Court, and ordered to be recorded. "The undersigned Commissioners appointed by an order of the County Court of Southampton in relation to the bridge at South Quay, ask leave to report. That previous to the issuing of your order, at the instance of the T. and R. R. Company, Messrs. J. Smith had engaged to execute the Work mentioned in said order, that the Work has been fully executed and the Draw arch in the said Bridge properly enlarged by the said Messrs. J. Smith is the opinion of the undersigned, and if said bridge was now in good order they could not hesitate to recommend the payment of at least the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, that is to say the proportion of that sum belonging to this County, to said Messrs. J. Smith being the amount the work was estimated to cost: but the undersigned feel themselves compelled to make known to the Court, the fact that since the completion of said work the Steam Boat running up Blackwater, by running against the Bridge has thrown the draw arch out of its place in consequence of which the bridge is scarcely passable. As the Work was originally executed for the benefit of the R. R. Company and the Steamboat, and the latter has been the cause of the damage it is for the Court to say whether they will pay for the Work or not before the damage is repaired.
