take their receipts.

and Madison Monroe Jones, free negroes, to Arthur H. Holliman be & the same are hereby transfer

In motion of Benjamin Griffin, Sheriff of this County, Robert Drury is permitted to qualify as  
his Deputy, and thereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by law. The Court being of opinion  
that the said Robert Drury is a man of honesty, sobriety and good demeanor.

Ordered that Samuel M. Pond be added to the Commissioners heretofore appointed to view the Road  
lately opened from Broad Water Road to the Petersburg and that said Commissioners make report thereof  
to this Court.

The Commissioners appointed at the March Court 1836 to let to the lowest undertaker the opening of  
a new Road from the Smithfield Road near the corner of Shadrick Rogers fence to strike the  
Colony Point road near Lewis N Branch. this day made a report, which is approved of by the Court  
and ordered to be recorded, and is in the following words, to wit, "Whereas G. H. Gray, Lewis N.  
Branch and myself were appointed by the Court as Commissioners to let to the lowest undertaker  
the opening of a Road from the Broad Water Road to the Petersburg road which was  
undertaken by the said Lewis N Branch for the sum of Three hundred & forty one dollars &  
25 cents which road was opened by the said Branch and a Report made at June Court  
last stating that there was some deficiency in the work, whereupon Lewis the money and or-  
dered the Sheriff to pay the same whenever the Commissioners should report that the work was  
completed according to the contract. I hereby certify that I have viewed the said Road, and  
that it is now complete agreeable to the terms on which it was let. Given under my hand  
this 12th day of November 1836. A. S. H. Burgess Surviving Commisr."
