This day came the parties by their counsels and the Commissioners appointed to act under an interlocutory decree of this Court pronounced at the September term 1836, made their report which is ordered to be recorded, and is as follows, to wit, "Southampton County Oct 22nd 1836. In obedience to the annual order of the last September Court, we the Commissioners, having duly advertised the time and place, according to the decree, did this day proceed to sell to the highest bidder upon the premises on a credit of nine months the lands named in the said decree belonging to the heirs of Nathan Britt and when Davis Bryant became the purchaser for the sum of five hundred and five dollars and who has complied with the terms in the following manner (to wit)

The above bonds were all signed by Davis Bryant, as principal, and Clements Rochelle, as security, and in consequence of a mistake the amount of each bond was by consent of parties altered to the sums stated above, and those bonds which were made payable to the parties Mary Britt, Patk. Griffon, Sally M. Britt and Jeth. Taylor were paid over by the Commissioners to their respective owners as directed in the said order and their receipts taken for the same and those made payable to the Comrs. for the benefit of the infant parties (to wit) Mary A. Britt, James W. Britt, Portland B. Britt, Louisa C. Britt & Nathan H. Britt, your Commissioners by leave to return with this report, in order that they may be released from further responsibility. Given under our hands as Comrs. of the Court this day and year first written. Jas. Magel. Clerk Overitt." Whereupon, by consent of parties, it is decreed and ordered that the sale and division aforesaid in manner and form as aforesaid be made firm and stable & forever binding between the parties.

Ordered that James W. Parker be appointed possessor in the room of Davis Bryant who is deceased.

This day came the plaintiff, by his attorney, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, that the defendant had had legal notice of the motion, he was solemnly called but came not.
