The Court proceeded to elect a Commissioner of the Revenue, in Newbury Parish, to supply the vacancy
 created by the death of George H. Gray decd. and upon taking the votes were as the final vote
 resulted, as follows.

For John H. Thomas, the votes were - Nicholas M. Seibell, James Mayet, Jeremiah Cobb, Alexander Skidmore,
 Robert T. Maguire, James L. Haysburg, James Clayton & Benj. L. Devany.

For James M. Helms, the votes were - Carr Bowers, Joseph T. Blauvelt and Jesse Parker.
 Abraham John H. Thomas having a majority of the votes was duly elected Commissioner of the Revenue in
 Newbury Parish in this County, for the ensuing year. And thereupon the said John H. Thomas together
 with Jeremiah Cobb his security, entered in to and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one
 thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs, which said bond is ordered to be recorded.

Mayors Linn, by letter, resigned his Office of Constable in the upper district in Newbury Parish; and there-
 upon the Court unanimously appointed Samuel M. Bond Constable to supply said vacancy. The Court
 being of opinion that the said Bond is a man of honesty, probity and good demeanor. And thereupon the
 said Samuel M. Bond took the several oaths prescribed by law, and with Jeremiah Cobb and William D.
 Reed, his securities, entered in to and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law
 directs, which bond was acknowledged by the several obligors thereto, and ordered to be recorded.
