Lot No 2. Containing six hundred and fourteen acres, being the English and other tracts adjoining, valued at one thousand eight hundred and forty two dollars - drawn by Josephthah Thomas & Mary Jane Powell who receive from Robert S. Barnes, the sum of ninety one dollars which makes one fourth of the valuation aforesaid - and bounded by the lands of Holliday Powell, Thomas Newsum, Jesse Norrell, William Bryant, Jacob Barnes and others. Lot No 3. Containing four hundred and sixty acres, lying in Northampton County North Carolina. Valued at one thousand seven hundred and sixty dollars, drawn by Benjamin Claridge Norrell who receive from said Robert S. Barnes the sum of one hundred and seventy three dollars which makes one fourth part of the valuation aforesaid and bounded by the lands of Nicholas Syner, Jacob Liles decd, Coath Liles and others. And Lot No 4. Containing two hundred and forty two acres being part of in the tract of Sams formerly owned by Richard C. Norrell decd. - drawn by Robert S. Barnes (in right of his wife Matilda) and valued at two thousand three hundred and three dollars. To pay Coath Emeline Norrell one hundred and six dollars to Josephthah T. & Mary J. Powell, ninety one dollars and to Benja. C. Norrell one hundred and seventy three dollars. - The Lot no. 4 bounded by the lands of Jacob Jordan, Tho^d B. Norrell, Josiah Ferguson, Zachary Story, Amanda M. Norrell's dower land and others. We have also allotted to the Widow (Jempanance Norrell) the following Negro Slaves, as her dower or share in the slaves of said decd. to wit, Negro man Luke, valued at one thousand dollars, Minchen eight hundred dollars, boy Demey six hundred and fifty dollars, Dick four hundred dollars, girl Amasa four hundred & fifty dollars, Sarah four hundred dollars, old Libby two hundred dollars, boy Nat five hundred dollars, boy & child Mason seven hundred and fifty dollars, Mary & four children namely, Dick Anthony, Christian & Luch. twelve hundred dollars, old Mills two hundred dollars, boy Demey (from Williams) two hundred and seventy five dollars, and girl Harriet seven hundred dollars (making the sum of seven thousand, four hundred and twenty five dollars. Valuation of the dower Negroes) - The balance of the slaves of said decd. we have divided into four lots and allotted them as follows, to wit, Lot No 1. to Robert S. Barnes (in right of his wife Matilda) - Negro man Alfred, valued at one thousand dollars, Dora at the time he was advanced to said Barnes, four hundred dollars, girl Lou at the time she was advanced, one hundred dollars, Giny seven hundred dollars, Arrens and three children, namely Chany, Radick & Martha, one thousand dollars, Phillis & two children namely Libby & Minny, six hundred dollars. - making the sum of Three thousand eight hundred dollars, and the said Robert S. Barnes to pay over to each of the other distributees the sum of twelve dollars and fifty cents (making of 37.50) Lot No 2. to Josephthah T. and Mary Jane Powell, to wit, Negro man Wright valued at one thousand dollars, boy Nat six hundred and fifty dollars, Bynum six hundred dollars, girl Salina four hundred and fifty dollars, Pripa four hundred dollars, and Maria six hundred and fifty dollars, making the sum of three thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars also to receive from Robert S. Barnes the sum of twelve dollars & fifty cents, which makes one fourth part of the valuation of the slaves exclusive of the dower slaves. Lot No 3 to Coath Emeline Norrell, to wit, Negro man Lewis valued at one thousand dollars, Jack eight hundred dollars, Woman Margaret, seven hundred dollars, Venus and two children namely Everett and Starup eight hundred and fifty dollars, old Solomon two hundred dollars, making the sum of three thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars, also to receive from Robert S. Barnes the sum of twelve dollars & fifty cents, which makes one fourth part of the valuation of the slaves as aforesaid. Lot No 4 to Benjamin C. Norrell, to wit, Negro man Frank valued at one thousand dollars, Ben

well, seven hundred dollars, Dinah Milly and Chila Emeline eight hundred dollars, making the sum of three thousand seven hundred and fifty or thereabouts. - Robert S.
