Norrell, William Bryant, Jacob Barnes and others. - Lot No 3. Containing four hundred and forty acres, lying in Northampton County North Carolina. Valued at one thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars. drawn by Benjamin Clavige Norrell who receive from said Robert S Barnes the sum of one hundred and seventy three dollars which makes one fourth part of the valuation aforesaid and bounded by the lands of Nicholas Syner, Jacob Liles and others. - And Lot No 4. Containing Two hundred and forty two acres being part of the tract of Land formerly owned by Richard C. Norrell aec. - drawn by Robert S. Barnes (in right of his wife Matilda) and valued at two thousand three hundred and three dollars. - To pay Judith Comeline Norrell one hundred and six dollars to Josephiah T & Mary J. Powell, ninety one dollars and to Benja. C. Norrell one hundred and seventy three dollars. - The Lot no. 4 bounded by the lands of Jacob Jordan, Tho. B. Norrell, Josiah Ferguson, Jackson Story, Amanda M. Norrell's dower land and others. We have also allotted to the Widow (Temperance Norrell) the following Negro Slaves, as her Dower or otherwise in the slaves of said (deed) to wit. Negro man Luke, valued at one thousand dollars. Ninches Eight hundred dollars, boy Demoy six hundred and fifty dollars, Dick four hundred dollars, girl Amenza four hundred & fifty dollars, Sarah four hundred dollars, old Silvy two hundred dollars, boy Nat five hundred dollars, Lucy & Child Mason seven hundred and fifty dollars, Mary & four children namely, Dick Anthony, Christian & Such - twelve hundred dollars, old Willis two hundred dollars, boy Demoy (from Williamis) two hundred and seventy five dollars, and girl Harriet seven hundred dollars (one thousand) The sum of Seven Thousand, five hundred and twenty five dollars. Valuation of the dower Negroes - the balances of the slaves of said deed we have divided into four lots and allotted them as follows, to wit, Lot No 1. to Robert S. Barnes (in right of his wife Matilda) - Negro man Alfred, valued at one thousand dollars. Dred at the time he was advanced to said Barnes, four hundred dollars, girl Lou at the time she was advanced, one hundred dollars, Genny seven hundred dollars, Armon and three children, namely Chang, Radick & Martha, one thousand dollars, Phillips & two children namely Silvy & Minny, six hundred dollars, making the sum of Three thousand eight hundred dollars, and the said Robert S. Barnes to pay over to each of the other distributees the sum of twelve dollars and fifty cents (making of \$37.50) - Lot No 2. to Josephiah T. and Mary Jane Powell, to wit, Negro man Wright valued at one thousand dollars, boy Nat, six hundred and fifty dollars, Bynum six hundred dollars, girl Salina four hundred and fifty dollars, Prissa four hundred dollars, and Mariah six hundred and fifty dollars, making the sum of three thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars also to receive from Robert S. Barnes the sum of twelve dollars & fifty cents, which makes one fourth part of the valuation of the slaves exclusive of the dower slaves. - Lot No 3 to Judith Comeline Norrell, to wit, Negro man Lewis valued at one thousand dollars, Jack eight hundred dollars, Woman Margaret, seven hundred dollars, Venus and two children namely Everett and Mansfield eight hundred and fifty dollars, old Solomon two hundred dollars, making the sum of three thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars, also to receive from Robert S. Barnes the sum of twelve dollars & fifty cents, which makes one fourth part of the valuation of the slaves as aforesaid. - Lot No 4 to Benjamin C. Norrell, to wit, Negro man Frank valued at one thousand dollars, but
