Morrell admr. de bonis non of Richd. E. Morrell by the court appointed by a decree of the County Court of Southampton, to divide the slaves of said Richd. E. Morrell decd. also those decreed of the County Court of Southampton to divide the slaves of Paddy Williams decd. Respectfully submitted to the Court. This day came the parties, by their counsel, and the Commissioners appointed to act under an interlocutory decree pronounced in this cause at October Court 1836, made their Report, which is ordered to be recorded, and is as follows. "Accordingly to a decree of the County Court of Southampton to us directed, dated October Court 1836 and hereto annexed. We the undersigned Commissioners, in obedience to the requisitions thereof after viewing the tract of land of which Richard E. Morrell decd possessed containing seven hundred and ninety acres, have allotted to Amanda M. Morrell widow of said Richard E. Morrell decd — Two hundred and forty eight acres thereof, on the East side of the plantation as her dower or thirds of the same, and bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at Ethelwren Daughtry's corner thence a new line, S 14° E 330 poles to a corner in Allen's line, thence along Allen's line to Henry Jones' line, thence his line to Swatney's line, thence along said Swatney's line to Lafayette Brown's line, thence his line to Benja Whitfield's line thence his line to said Daughtry's line, thence his line to the first station. We have also allotted to the said Amanda M. Morrell the following named slaves of said Richard E. Morrell decd as her dower of half of the same, to wit, Negro man Mills valued at eight hundred dollars, boy Esten at eight hundred dollars, Isaham six hundred dollars, girl Edna six hundred and fifty dollars, Delila & three children namely Mary and Clay one thousand one hundred and fifty dollars and Celiza three hundred dollars, making the sum of four thousand three hundred dollars valuation of the auct slaves. — the balance of the slaves of the said decd. we have allotted to Thomas B. Morrell admr. de bonis non of Richd. E. Morrell decd. and admr. of Lewis Morrell decd, to wit, Negro man Wright valued at one thousand dollars, Solomon two hundred dollars, Benjamin seven hundred dollars, da Patience twenty dollars, Covert two hundred and eighty dollars, Venus & Chila Nanissa, seven hundred and fifty dollars, Margaret seven hundred dollars and Maria six hundred and fifty dollars, making the sum of four thousand three hundred dollars. " Whereupon, by consent of parties, it is decreed and ordered that the division aforesaid in manner and form aforesaid be held firm and stable and forever binding between the parties.
